This artwork depicts the banksia, most of which need fire for the pods to release the seeds; though fire burns through the land, in the ashes, growth is found. This symbolises the end of one journey is the start of another. The yellow centre piece symbolises student journeys as they come from all different nations, coming into AFTRS and then making their journey out into the industry and back to Community. Red symbolizes the fire and the pathways it makes on the land, underneath this showing the circles representing the renewal of the seeds, the beginning of a new journey.

Across the artwork, we see how students have grown during their time at AFTRS, and how they will continue to grow as they leave AFTRS and enter the next phase of their careers.
